<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• October 2023 Grievance Report – Tasso Kandris               <p><b>MHS Grievances</b></p> <p>The QAPI office received a total of 63 Legal grievances and 36 Non – Legal Grievances for the Fiscal year 22-23. For the FY22-23, there were three (3) grievances related to Access to Care, thirty – one (31) Quality of Care, four (4) Related to Customer Service, eight (8) Related to Case Manager and Seventeen (17) Filed for Other Reason. The grievances were resolve at 87% timely.</p> <p><b>SUD Grievances</b></p> <p>The QAPI office received a total of twelve (12) Legal grievances and seven (7) Non – Legal Grievances for the Fiscal year 22-23. For the FY22-23, there were six (6) grievances related to Access to Care, two (2) Related to Customer Service and four (4) Filed for Other Reason. Proposition 1 will provide \$1Billion to ensure that our Veterans who are experiencing homelessness, mental health and substance use issues receive the care and housing they need to recover and stabilize.</p> </li> </ul>
